Musings from the Manse

Fleming Rutledge's book Crucifixion: Understanding the Death of Jesus Christ is a heavy book, in many senses. It is nearly 700 pages of distilled wisdom from Fleming Rutledge's many years of reflections on the cross of Christ. It is deep, it is thought provoking and it is wonderful.

Sometimes only a 'big book' will do a subject justice, and this is certainly the case here. Yet it is not a tome that resides solely within the prevue of the academic it is written with a warmth and a passion that will allow anyone who like's a 'serious book' to gain from its wisdom. It is a book that would certainly give me something to think about on my desert island.

As we approach the season of Lent, pausing to reflect upon the cross of Christ is something we should perhaps all consider, and whether this is aided by the words of Fleming Rutledge, the words of Scripture, or by someone else, as we journey towards the cross may its transforming and gracious hope speak to us afresh.
